Marysville Fire District 12 has an overall response time of 8.2 minutes, and emergency calls have increased increasing the need for a Regional Joint Station. We have been working with The City of Marysville, The City of Arlington, and Tulalip Tribes to create a joint district to improve safety in the area. Our team is working on grant applications to help supplement funding, and a ballot measure. This should be on the August 2018 Ballot and needs a Majority Approval, meaning 51 percent or more.

At the request of The Tulalip Resort Casino (TRC), TDS reached out to Apple Development to create an Application or software to convert our English only menus and make them available in Chinese. TRC researched the costs of printing new menus to accommodate their needs, and the Application would be more cost effective and appeal to their customer base.
